Hard Copy of application form is to be submitted along with necessary documents in the college office.

- Parents/students should go through the Prospectus and the Guidelines as well as Admission Notices put up on the notice board, before seeking admission in the college
- Admission is as per merit and other norms laid down by the University, the Government or the Management from time to time
- Principal reserves the right to amend/modify the guidelines regarding the admission, as and when such amendments/modifications are received from the University, Government or the Management. They will be notified accordingly on the notice board
- Principal also reserves the right to refuse admission, in case such an admission, in his/her opinion, is likely to adversely affect the overall discipline in the college.
- Students are advised to write their phone numbers along with guardian / Parents phone numbers in the admission form.
- Students can seek help from **ADMISSION COUNSELING CELL** for entire admission process. Application for admission to the college is made on the prescribed printed form. The form must be accompanied by:
- Form for Identity Card with 2x2 size self-recent photographs. 1)
- Transfer Certificate and Mark-Sheet of the last examination passed, with two true copies if coming from 2) a college affiliated to the Mumbai University/Maharashtra Board.
- Transfer Certificate, Migration Certificate, Passing Certificate and Mark Sheet of the last examination, 3) with two true copies if coming from a college affiliated to any other Board/University.
- Students coming from any other Board/University should submit the Provisional Eligibility Certificate from the University of Mumbai.
- FY Class students MUST fill up the PRE-ADMISSION ENROLMENT FORM of UNIVERSITY 5) of MUMBAI on Mumbai University website: mumoa.digitaluniversity.ac.in before taking the admission in the college.

N.B:

- 1. OFFLINE admission is completely closed for all courses.
- 2. No form will be accepted without the necessary accompaniments and two passport size photographs.
- Students who are granted admission must pay fees on the same day, failing which they will have NO **CLAIM** to the seat.
- A student once admitted has to pay the fees for the whole year even if he/she subsequently leaves the 7) college, or if his/her name is struck off the college roll.
- Leaving Certificate or Transference Certificate of the previous college will be required from each student wishing to join the college. It can be called for through the college authorities, if it has not been submitted at the time of admission.
- Those students who have already enrolled in University of Mumbai have to submit the NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE (N.O.C) issued from the Previous College at the time of seeking admission.

The Identity Card is not valid unless a **Stamp** size photograph of the student is affixed on the space provided and bears the college seal and Principal's signature and is signed by the student on the reverse side in the space provided. A fine of Rs 100/- will be levied on any student found without a valid Identity Card.
- 13) Students should get receipt of every payment they make in the office. No complaint will be entertained if the corresponding receipt is not produced.

STUDENTS COMING FROM OUTSIDE THE STATE OF MAHARASHTRA AND ANY OTHER UNIVERSITY (OTHER THAN MUMBAI UNIV. /BOARD) FOR ADMISSION are required to submit provisional statement of eligibility certificate issued by eligibility section, Gr. Floor, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Bhavan, Vidyanagari, Mumbai.

They are required to bring Provisional Statement of Eligibility from Registrar, University of Mumbai, Kalina, Mumbai - 400 098 or Mumbai Divisional Board and also should pay Eligibility fee of Rs. 320.00 while seeking admission.

Students must submit following certificates within one month after the admission, with three attested photocopies.

- 1. Migration Certificate
- 2. Passing Certificate
- 3. Statement of Marks

Except Migration other certificates shall be returned in the month of March.

COLLEGE DEPOSIT

Application for refund of college deposits must be made on the prescribed form accompanied by the relevant deposit receipts within one year of applicant's ceasing to be a regular student of the college, failing which the college deposits will be forfeited. The period of one year will be counted from the last date of term, last attended by the applicant or in case of the student leaving the college with the permission of the principal during the course; from the date he/she is permitted to leave the college.

N.B.: A fees receipt and Identity Card must be produced while applying for refund of fees or college deposits. A penalty of Rs. 50/- will be levied for each receipt lost by the student and consequently not attached to the application for withdrawal of the deposits.

- (iii) From 21st day upto 50 days after the 30% of the Total Amount of Fees Commencement of Academic Term of the Course
- (iv) From 51st day upto 80 days after the 50% of the Total Amount of Fees commencement of academic term of the course or August 31st whichever is earlier.
- (v) From September 1st to September 30th 60% of the Total Amount of Fees.
- (vi) After September 30th 100% of the Total Amount of Fees.

NOTE: The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of academic term of the course includes the following::-

- 1. All the fee items chargeable for one year are as per relevant University circulars for different Faculties (excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities).
- 2. The fee charged towards group insurance and all fee components to be paid as University share (including Vice-Chancellor fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, disaster management fund, exam fee and Enrollment fee) are nonrefundable if payment is made by the college prior to the date of cancellation.
- 3. Fee collected for Identity card and Library card, admission form and prospectus, enrollment and any other course specific fee **are not refundable** after the commencement of the academic term.
- 4. All refundable deposits (Laboratory, Caution Money and Library etc.) **shall be fully returned** at the time of cancellation.

Provided that wherever admissions are made through centralized admission process for professional and/or for any other courses by other competent Authorities, the Refund Rules are applicable if specified by such authorities (as per the rules of relevant agencies) for the 1st year admission. In case of admission to subsequent years of the course, O.2859 is applicable for cancellation of admission.

Provided further that this refund rules is concurrent with the rules and guidelines of other professional statutory bodies appointed for admission for relevant courses.

Further that O.2859-A & O.2859-B have been replaced and the amended O.2859 relating to the refund of Tuition Fees, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admission for the Under Graduate Courses has been brought into force with effect from the academic year 2009-20010.

Dates for Refund of Deposits (Self Financing Courses): -

Application for the refund of deposits must be made between 1st Sep. to 30th Sep or 1st Feb. to 28th Feb. of the year when applicant ceases to be a student of the college, failing which the deposit will be forfeited.

Students Accidental Insurance Benefit Scheme:

The Scheme will cover the following three contingencies in case of Accidents. This scheme can be covered 24 hours hospitalization, due to accident cause only, no natural death and sickness covered.

A. 100% coverage in case of sad demise of the insured.

B. 100% coverage for permanent disability (Disability means loss of limbs, loss of eye sight or sense of hearing or paralysis).

C. 100% coverage for hospitalization expenses arising out of accidents which includes cost of Medicines as well as expenses for Doctor fees.

Accidents death includes Rail/Road/Air Accidents injury due to any violent collision. Fall injury due to Fire, Explosion, Snakebite, Frostbite, Burn Injury, Drowning, Poisoning, Natural Calamity, Riots but it will not include suicide or attempt to suicide. These are only illustrative and not an exhaustive list of types of accidents.

Lateral Transfer from Self Financing Courses to B.Com.

In case of lateral transfer from Self Financing Courses to B.Com. Courses like BMS and BAF the credits awarded to a successful student at Semester I and Semester II of these courses is 42 i.e. 21+21. Similarly in case of BBI and BFM the credits awarded are 36 i.e. 18+18. Whereas in case of B.Com, 40 credits are awarded to a successful student at Semester I & Semester II taken together i.e 20+20.

- i. In case of learner who has successfully completed FYBMS/FYBAF and is admitted to the Second year of the regular B.Com. Course i.e. S.Y.B.Com., the learner should undertake the study and the examinations for all the subjects at the S.Y. and TY. The passing criterion and admission criterion to higher classes shall be applicable to such candidate. However while preparing the grade card for SY the performance of such a learner at FC course in Semester III or IV whichever is lower should not be included in the final grade sheet.
- ii. In case of a learner moves from FYBMS to SYBAF or from FYBAF to SYBMS the credits and grade are carried forward.
- iii. In case of a learner who has failed in one / more courses at FYBMS/FYBAF and is admitted to the Second year of the regular B.Com. Program or is admitted to SYBMS / SYBAF after studying FYBAF/FYBMS respectively will have to pass the subject(s)/course(s) failed at the BMS/BAF program under the parent program from the parent college only.
- iv. In case of a learner who successfully completes First year of the B.B.I./B.F.M. program and is admitted to the Second year of the regular B.Com. Program, the learner should study the FC paper I of First Year at Semester I and at Semester II which carry two credits each, pass the courses and earn these 4 additional credits which are required to earn a total of 40 credits as done by a FYBCOM learner. The learner can earn the credits before the result of the learner for Sem. VI is declared failing which the result may be kept in abeyance. In case of a learner who has failed in one/more courses at

FYBBI/FYBFM and is admitted to the Second year of the regular B.Com. program or is admitted to SYBBI / SYBFM after studying FYBFM/FYBBI respectively will have to pass the subject(s)/course(s) failed at the BBI/BFM program under the parent program from the parent college only. Guidelines will be applicable as per University new circular.

- 2) Applying for the Photo/Xerox copy of the answer book or having Photo/Xerox copy of the answer book shall not be a pre-requisite for applying for revaluation of the answer book in the said subject
- 3) The student can independently apply for revaluation OR Photo/Xerox or Both simultaneously.
- 4) If the examinee is not satisfied with marks awarded, he/she may independently apply for revaluation in prescribed form within the period and in the manner prescribed whether or not he/she has applied for Photo/Xerox copy/ies of the same.
- 5) The revaluation Facility shall be for theory papers only.
- 6) The revaluation of answer book shall not be permitted in respect of the marks awarded to the scripts of practical examination / term work / seasonal work / project work / dissertation / internal assessment / term work (including theory part) and in viva voce / oral / practical examination.

- 7) A candidate can apply for the revaluation of the answer book of the subject only if he/she has secured at least 20% of the total marks in that subject or 40% of the marks required for passing in the said subject, whichever is less or the grade equivalent to the above criteria where grades are assigned to the theory paper.
- 8) The prescribed application form for revaluation of answer book can be obtained from the College office during working hours.
- 9) For re-evaluation: The non-refundable prescribed fees of Rs. 310/- (for Open) & Rs. 160/- (for reserved) per subject per answer book for the purpose of revaluation shall be paid by the examinee.
- 10) For Photo/Xerox copy: The non-refundable prescribed fees of Rs. 50/- (for Open) & Rs. 25/- (for reserved) per subject per answer book for the purpose of revaluation shall be paid by the examinee.
- 11) The prescribed application form for revaluation of answer books duly filled in and signed by the applicant /examinee only is to be submitted along with the statement of marks, prescribed fees as above and question paper/s for which he/she intends to apply for revaluation with SEVEN (07) working days from date of declaration of the results of the respective examination or from the date on which the statement of marks whichever is later. Incomplete form and form not accompanied by relevant documents may be rejected without assigning any reason whatsoever.

Under ordinance No. 119,120, 125 of the University of Mumbai, a learner is required to attend minimum 75% of the lectures in each subject and concerned practical during the academic year, failing which he/she shall render himself/herself liable for cancellation of term, and be debarred from appearing in final examinations. failing which he/she shall render himself/herself liable for cancellation of term, and be debarred from appearing in final examinations

As per Circular No 4077 of 2008 of the University of Mumbai, Visually and Partially Visually Impaired Students, Physically Challenged Students and Students affected by Cerebral Palsy are permitted a Writer for their examinations, and will also be provided Extra Time for completion of their papers.

As per the University of Mumbai Circular No CERT/CONV/1058 of 2008, students who "intend to apply for duplicate copies of their statements of marks, certificates of passing, degree certificates as well as special certificates have to produce an affidavit on a Non Judicial Stamp Paper of Rs 50/- made in that behalf before the Metropolitan Magistrate or a Notary appointed by the Government to that effect, the Reason for issue of the duplicate copy of the aforesaid documents mentioning therein so also, the First Information Report(FIR) registered in the Police Station for the reasons what so ever, i.e. Loss, Damage of the same etc to check the misuse of the aforesaid documents. On completion of these formalities and payment of necessary fees, the required duplicate certificates will be issued to the concerned students".

R. 8668 Scaling Down the Marks Obtained by the Learner at the Internal Examination as Compared to the Marks Obtained by the Learner in the Semester End Theory Examination in the Course Concerned Introduced with effect from 2013-14 and is applicable for all semesters of all programs (aided and non-aided) of UG and PG for Credit Based Semester and Grading System under Faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce

- a. Concept of scaling shall be applicable only for the marks obtained by the learners at all the individual courses.
- b. Marks obtained by the learner at the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examinations should be converted to the percentage marks course wise.
- c. Concept of scaling shall be applicable only in cases where the marks obtained by the learner in the Internal Assessment and Semester End Assessment Examinations differ by more than 20% in the course concerned i.e. percentage marks of the learner at a course in the Internal Assessment is 20% more than the percentage of marks scored by the learner concerned in the Semester End Examination in the course concerned.

- d. Learner at the course concerned in the Internal Assessment should be scaled down to 20% plus the percentage score of the learner at the Semester End Examination.
- e. The concept of scaling shall be applicable only in course/s where the learner has passed the course. In case if a learner fails in one or more courses at an attempt then the concept of scaling shall be applied to the courses that the learner has passed at the attempt concerned and for the remaining courses where the learner has failed, the concept of scaling will be applicable as and when the learner passes the course or earns the credit for the course.
- f. The scaled marks can thus be used to calculate the Credits, Grades, Credit points earned by the learner can then be used to calculate the GPA, SGPA and CGPA.
- g. Concept of scaling shall not be applicable where the percentage of the marks scored by the learner at the Semester End Examination is more than the percentage marks scored by the learner in the Internal Assessment at the course concerned. One of the reasons for the learner scoring low marks at the Internal Assessment could be nonappearance for one of the components of the Internal Assessment.

- a) If on previous occasion a disciplinary action was taken against a student for malpractice used at examination and he/she is caught again for malpractices used at the examinations, in this event he/she shall be dealt with severely. Enhanced punishment can be imposed on such students. This enhanced punishment may extend to double the punishment provided for the offence, when committed at the second or subsequent examination.
- b) Practical / Dissertation / Project Report Examination.: Student involved in malpractices at Practical / Dissertation / Project Report Examinations shall be dealt with as per the punishment provided for the theory examination.
- c) The competent authority, in addition to above mentioned punishments, may impose a fine on the student declared guilty.

^{* (}Note: The term "Annulment of Performance in Full." includes performance of the student at the theory as well as Annual Practical Examination, but does not include performance at term work, project work with its term work, oral or practical & dissertation examinations unless malpracticed).

CO - CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1) NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S.)

College has a very active National Service Scheme unit working with full enthusiasm. NSS is a two year programme. In every academic year 100 students are admitted in NSS. The objective of the NSS is "To develop the personality of students through community service". The programme inculcates leadership qualities, spirit of service to society, initiation and dedication to social cause. A student enrolled in NSS has to work for continuous two years and is expected to put in at least 120 hours of social service in each of the academic years. The enrolled NSS volunteer is also expected to participate in at least one 07 days special camp during his enrollment in NSS of two years. As per circular No. UG/112 of 2015, Ordinance 0.229 a student completing 120 hrs of NSS for a year will be eligible for the award of 10 marks grace in addition to the marks secured in each head of passing. Also in case of failure in one or more heads of passing (Subjects) benefit of 10 marks shall be granted to the extent of 5% of the maximum marks allotted to the subject. This additional 10 marks grace will be granted for the purpose of enabling the student for the award of first class or distinction. Whereas in case of credit base grading system (CBGS) the 0.1 will be added in the GPA even if benefit is given to the student for passing the subject/s.

2) NATIONAL CADET CORPS (N.C.C.)

College has submitted a proposal to start N.C.C. unit for boys & girls from the area ARMY, NAVY & AIRWING in S.I.C.E.S. College from academic year 2011-12 .The permission is awaited. Students who are interested in enrolling in N.C.C. should submit an application giving details such as class, division & Roll. No. in General Office.

3) CAREER COUNSELINGAND PLACEMENT CELL

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell of the College is dynamic body functioning to provide whole some development to the students. The cell works under the guidance of placement committee who are supported by student representatives.

CODE OF CONDUCT

ANTI-RAGGING CELL: Rules & Regulations SUMMARY OF UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009.

PREAMBLE: In view of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 8.05.2009 and in consideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging.

WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING?

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
- g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

ADIMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING:

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:

The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.

The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;

- a) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- b) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- c) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- d) Withholding results.
- e) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- f) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- g) Cancellation of admission.
- h) Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- i) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie, (i) in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; (ii) in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor. (iii) in case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.

Where in the opinion of the appointing authority, a lapse is attributable to any member of the faulty or staff of the institution, in the matter of reporting or taking prompt action to prevent an incident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude towards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations or otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action, in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faulty or staff. Provided that where such lapse is attributable to the Head of the institution, the authority designated to appoint such Head shall take such departmental disciplinary action; and such action shall be without prejudice to any action that may be taken under the penal laws for abetment of ragging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.
