


INTRODUCTION







No college shall conduct any entrance test in any form and the admissions are purely based on merit duly following the reservation policy as per the norms of Government of Maharashtra. While drawing the merit list, weightage has to be given to students from Arts, Commerce and Science Stream at 12th standard level. The stream wise weightage to be given is as under:

The applications are to be accepted and processed by the colleges stream wise separately and the merit list is to be displayed stream wise taking into account the reservation policy prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra.

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1. The merit list is to be prepared and displayed stream wise.

- 2. Incase if no applications are received under the "Diploma in Engineering and other Category" or if the seats remain vacant in "Diploma in Engineering and other Category" after all the merit lists/forms are exhausted, the vacant seats must be transferred to Commerce Stream.
- 3. In case if no application is received from any stream the vacant seats are to be distributed equally between the remaining two streams only.

After the first merit list is displayed, if any seat allotted to on stream remains vacant, the same shall be distributed equally between the remaining two streams. In case of vacancy in one stream is of single/odd number of seats, the single seat is to be allotted to the Commerce Stream. In case if no applications are available from the two streams, then all the vacant seats of such two streams must be transferred to the third stream.

5.Step (d) be repeated for the subsequent merit list still all the forms are exhausted or the final merit list is displayed, whichever is earlier.

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

ADMISSION TO DESIRED COURSE AT ALL LEVEL TO ANY OF THE STREAMS CONSISTS OF TWO PHASES:

University Online & College Online.

- Filling of University On-line Registration & Selection of required course in college (within dates mentioned by the University) via University of Mumbai Website (www.mum.digitaluniversity.ac.in_).
- Filling of Online College admission form via college website (<u>www.sicescollege.edu.in</u>)
- Payment of fees via college website after receiving verification message from college through SMS/email.
- Admission is as per merit and other norms laid down by the University of Mumbai from time to time.
- Principal reserves the right to amend/modify the guidelines regarding the admission, as and
 when such amendments/modifications are received from the University. They will be notified
 accordingly in the college website.
- Principal also reserves the right to refuse admission, in case such an admission, in his/her
 opinion, is likely to adversely affect the overall discipline in the college.
- Parents / Students can seek help from COLLEGE ONLINE ADMISSION HELPLINE
 TEAM (ADMISSION COUNSELLING CELL) for entire admission process.

THE ADMISSION FORM MUST BE SUBMITTED ALONG WITH FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS:

- 1. Online University & College form, Leaving Certificate and Mark-Sheet of the last examination passed, with two true copies if coming from a college affiliated to the University of Mumbai/Maharashtra Board.
- 2. Online University & College form, Transfer Certificate, Migration Certificate, Passing Certificate and Mark Sheet of the last examination, with two true copies if coming from a college affiliated to any other Board/University.

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3. Students coming from any other Board/University should submit the Provisional Eligibility Certificate from the University of Mumbai.

- - 4. Students have to submit the hard copy of the above document for final confirmation. (Schedule for submission of documents will be notified on the college website).
 - 5. Admission form will not be accepted without the required documents.
 - 6. A student once admitted has to pay the fees ONLINE for the whole year even if he/she subsequently leaves the college, or if his/her name is struck off the college roll.
 - 7. No-Objection certificate (N.O.C) AND Transfer Certificate of the previous college will be required from each student desire to join the college. It can be called for through the college authorities, if it has not been submitted at the time of admission.
 - 8. Students coming from outside the state of Maharashtra/Board and any other university (other than University of Mumbai/Board) for admission are required to pay **Eligibility fee of Rs.320.00** while seeking admission.
 - 9. Students from the States, other than Maharashtra, seeking admissions in this college, are hereby informed that they will not be issued original HSC documents i.e. Mark sheet, College Leaving certificate, passing certificate or any other certificate / document, unless the University of Mumbai confirms their admission.
 - 10. Final confirmation of admission will be done by University of Mumbai.
 - 11. The roll number to each student will be given at the time of admission. The roll number once allotted will not be changed during the year.
 - 12. On admission every student will receive an **ONLINE IDENTITY CARD** after first payment, which must always be carried and must be presented for inspection on demand. No student will be allowed to enter the college premises/Library/Laboratory/Gymkhana without a valid Identity Card. A fine of Rs.100/-will be levied on any student found without a valid Identity Card.
 - 13. Students should collect receipt of every payment they make in the office. No complaint will be entertained if the corresponding receipt is not produced. In A.Y.2021-22,Online receipts will be mailed to students on registered mail-ID.
 - For Change of Subject (Degree College) Rs. 50/- per subject shall be charged.
 - 14. N.R.I. students seeking admission in FY/SY/TY in any of the courses shall take the Prima Facia letter from University of Mumbai before seeking admission.

REFUND OF FEES

Degree College (Subject to revision from time to time)

Ordinance relating to the refund of all the fees shall be applicable to all the faculties 0.2859: Refund of Tuition, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admissions: The candidates who have taken admission in under graduate courses in Govt. colleges, in Govt. aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges, and recognized Institutions may request for refund of fees after

applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. There fund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30thday after the date of cancellation and thereafter. The percentage of fee for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows: -

- (ii) Upto 20 days after the Commencement 20% of the Total Amount of Fees of Academic Term of the Course.

- v) From September 1st to September 30th 60% of the Total Amount of Fees.
- vi) After September 30th 100% of the Total Amount of Fees.

The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of academic term of the course includes the following:-

- 1. All the fee items chargeable for one year are as per relevant University circulars for different Faculties (excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities).
- 2. The fee charged towards group insurance and all fee components to be paid as University share (including Vice Chancellor fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, disaster management fund, exam fee and Enrollment fee) are nonrefundable if payment is made by the college prior to the date of cancellation.
- 3. Fee collected for Identity card and Library card, admission form and prospectus, enrollment and any other course specific **are not refundable** after the commencement of the academic term.
- 4. All refundable deposits (Laboratory, Caution Money and Library etc.) **shall be fully returned** at the time of cancellation.

Provided that wherever admissions are made through centralized admission process for professional and/or for any other courses by other competent Authorities, the Refund Rules are applicable if specified by such authorities (as per the rules of relevant agencies) for the 1st year admission. In case of admission to subsequent years of the course, O.2859 is applicable for cancellation of admission.

Provided further that this refund rules is concurrent with the rules and guidelines of other professional statutory bodies appointed for admission for relevant courses.

Further that O.2859-A&O.2859-B have been replaced and the amendedO.2859 relating to their fund of Tuition Fees, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admission for the Under Graduate Courses has been brought into force with effect from the academic year 2008.

Standard of Passing

The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks (i.e. 40 out 100) in each subject. The learners shall obtain minimumof40% marks (i.e.10outof25) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e. 30 Out of 75) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade E in each project wherever applicable to pass a particular semester. A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes the Internal Assessment & Semester End Examination together.

As per University Circular no. UGC/61 OF 2015Additional Examinations for all courses are cancelled from Academic Year 2015-16.

Re-Exams will be conducted on medical grounds/ participation in sports/ cultural/ NCC Camps/ coaching camps for sports & cultural activities etc. as per R. 8439.

A.T.K.T. EXAMINATIONS WHICH WILL BE CONDUCTED TENTATIVELY IN THE MONTH OF OCTOBER & APRIL OF EVERY ACADEMIC YEAR FOR ALL SEMESTERS i.e. I, II, III & IV Internal Assessment

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Eligibility norms to appear for the additional class test or assignment or project for the learners who remained absent

- a) The Learner must apply to the Head of the Institution giving the reason(s) for absence within 8days from the conduct of the examination along with the necessary documents and testimonials. If the Learner is absent for participation in intercollegiate event, state or national or international level event, training camp or coaching camp organized by authorized University or State or National or International bodies, NSS, NCC event /camp/Cultural Activities / Sports Activities/Research Festival or any other activity authenticated by the Head of Institution. The head of the institution shall generally grant permission to the Learner to appear for additional class test or assignment.
- b) The Head of the Institution on scrutiny of the documents and testimonial may grant the permission to the learner to appear for the Additional Examination.
- c) It is not a right of learner who has failed or has remain absent to appear for the additional examination without fulfilling the norms prescribed by the Head of the Institution/ Department/ Principal of the College.

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R.8438Rules for ATKT for Arts and Commerce:

- a) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II irrespective of number of course of failure in Semester-I.
- b) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-III, if he/she passes each of Semester-I and Semester-II

OR

- A learner who fails in not more than four courses of Semester-I and Semester-II taken together with not\more than TWO courses at each of Semester I&II.
- c) A learner shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester IV irrespective of number of Courses of failure in Semester III.
- d) A learner shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester V, If he/she passes semester I, semester II, Semester III and Semester IV

OR

- A learner shall Pass Semester I and Semester II and fails in not more than FOUR Courses of Semester III and Semester IV taken together with not more than TWO courses attach of Semester III and Semester IV
- e) A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester VI irrespective of number of courses of failure in Semester V
- f) The Learner can appear for Semester VI Examination (subject to d and e above) but the result of Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, II, III, IV and

V.

Amended R.8438-Eligibility for Admission to all the Under Graduate Programs (aided and nonaided) in the Faculties of Arts and Commerce under Credit Based Semester and Grading System Eligibility criteria for a learner, to be admitted in Semester V(Third year) of UG programs(aided and non-aided) in Faculties of Arts and Commerce is amended as follows:

- Shall have passed I,II,III and IV in full OR a)
- Shall have passed Semester I and I in full and secured ATK T in the Second Year by failing in b) not more than 2Courses in each of Semester III and Semester IV

c) Shall have secured ATKT in First year by failing in not more than TWO courses in each of Semester I and Semester II and have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full.

Rules for ATKT for Science

- A learner shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester II irrespective of grades obtained in each courses of Semester-I.
- ii) A learner shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester III If he/she passes(grade 'E' or above in each course)each of Semester I and Semester II

He/she fails in not more than three courses, in each of Semester I and Semester II. (For all subjects carrying 900 or more marks)

A learner shall be allowed to keep terms for Semester IV irrespective grades obtained in each courses of Semester III

Note: As per University of Mumbai, rules of ATKT is exempted for A.Y. 2020-2021. All the FY and SY students are promoted to next academic year irrespective of their marks. But failed students have to clear all papers in the upcoming ATKT.

Amended R.8438-Eligibility for Admission to all the Under Graduate Programs (Aided and non-Aided) in the Faculties of Science under Credit Based Semester and Grading System

i) Learner shall have passed Semester I, II, III and IV in full.

Learner shall have passed Semester I and II in full and secured ATKT in Second Year by failing in For Programs with 900 and above marks in not more than THREE Courses in each of Semester III and IV .For Programs with less than 900 marks in not more than THREE Courses with not more than total 200marks in each of Semester III and IV.

OR

Learner shall have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full and secured ATKT in first year by failing in For Programs with 900 and above marks in not more than THREE Courses in each of Semester I and II. For Programs with less than 900marks in not more than THREE Courses with not more than total 200marks in each Semester I and II.

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Rules and Procedure for (Revaluation) providing Photo/Xerox copy/ies of assessed answer-book/s

1) Applying for Photo/Xerox copy of the Answer book and applying for revaluation will be 2independent processes.

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- 2) Applying for the Photo/Xerox copy of the answer book or having Photo/Xerox copy of the answer book shall not be a pre-requisite for applying for revaluation of the answer book in the said subject
- 3) The student can independently apply for revaluation OR Photo/Xerox or Both simultaneously.
- 4) If the examinee is not satisfied with marks awarded, he/she may independently apply for revaluation in prescribed form within the period and in the manner prescribed whether or not he/she has applied for Photo/Xerox copies of the same.
- 5) The revaluation Facility shall be for theory papers only.

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- 6) The revaluation of answer book shall not be permitted in respect of the marks awarded to the scripts of practical examination / term work / seasonal work / project work / dissertation / internal assessment / term work (including theory part) and in viva voce/oral/practical examination.
- A candidate can apply for the revaluation of the answer book of the subject only if he/she has secured at least 20% of the total marks in that subject or 40% of the marks required for passing in the said subject, whichever is less or the grade equivalent to the above criteria where grades are assigned to the theory paper.

- 8) The prescribed application form for revaluation of answer book can be obtained from the College office during working hours.
- 9) For re-evaluation: The non-refundable prescribed fees of Rs.310/-(for open)Rs.160/-(for reserved) per subject per answer book for the purpose of revaluation shall be paid by the examinee.
- 10) For Photo/Xerox copy: The non-refundable prescribed fees of Rs.60/-(for open)Rs. 35/-(for reserved)per subject per answer book for the purpose of revaluation shall be paid by the examinee.
- 11. The prescribed application form for revaluation of answer books duly filled in and signed by the applicant

/examinee only is to be submitted along with the statement of marks, prescribed fees as above and question paper/s for which he/she intends to apply for revaluation with 20 working days from date of declaration of the results of the respective examination or from the date on which the statement of marks whichever is later. Incomplete form and form not accompanied by relevant documents may be rejected without assigning any reason whatsoever.

Under ordinance No.119,120,125 of the University of Mumbai, a learner is required to attend minimum75% of the lectures in each subject and concerned practical during the academic year, failing which he/she shall render himself/herself liable for cancellation of term, and be debarred from appearing in final examinations. failing which he/she shall render himself/herself liable for cancellation of term, and be debarred from appearing in final examinations

AsperCircularNo4077of2008 of the University of Mumbai, Visually and Partially Visually Impaired Students, Physically Challenged Students and Students affected by Cerebral Palsy are permitted a Writer for their examinations, and will also be provided Extra Time for completion of their papers.

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As per the University of Mumbai Circular No. CERT/CONV/1058 of 2008, students who "intend to apply for duplicate copies of their statements of marks, certificates of passing, degree certificates as well as special certificates have to produce an affidavit on a Non Judicial Stamp Paper of Rs 50/-made in that behalf before the Metropolitan Magistrate or a Notary appointed by the Government to that effect, the Reason for issue of the duplicate copy of the aforesaid documents mentioning therein so also, the First Information Report(FIR) registered in the Police Station for the reasons whatsoever ,i.e. Loss, Damage of the same to check the misuse of the aforesaid documents. On completion of these formalities and payment of necessary fees, the required duplicate certificates will be issued to the concerned students".

R.8668 Scaling Down the Marks Obtained by the Learner at the Internal Examination as Compared to the Marks Obtained by the Learner in the Semester End Theory Examination in the Course Concerned Introduced with effect from 2013-14 and is applicable for all semesters of all programs (aided and non aided) of UG and PG of Credit Based Semester and Grading System under Faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce

- a. Concept of scaling shall be applicable only for the marks obtained by the learners at all the individual courses.
- b. Marks obtained by the learner at the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examinations should be converted to the percentage marks course wise.

- c. Concept of scaling shall be applicable only in cases where the marks obtained by the learner in the Internal Assessment and Semester End Assessment Examinations differ by more than 20% in the course concerned i.e. percentage marks of the learner at a course in the Internal Assessment is 20% more than the percentage of marks scored by the learner concerned in the Semester End Examination in the course concerned Learner at the course concerned in the Internal Assessment should be scaled down to 20% plus the percentage score of the learner at the Semester End Examination.
- d. The concept to of scaling shall be applicable only in course/s where the learner has passed the course. Incase if a learner fails in one or more courses at an attempt then the concept of scaling shall be applied to the courses that the learner has passed at the attempt concerned and for the remaining courses where the learner has failed, the concept of scaling will be applicable as and when the learner passes the course or earns the credit for the course.
- e. The scaled marks can thus be used to calculate the Credits, Grades, Credit points earned by the learner can then be used to calculate the GPA, SGPA and CGPA.
- f. Concept of scaling shall not be applicable where the marks scored by the learner at the semester end examination is more than marks scored by the learner in the Internal Assessment at the course concerned. One of the reasons for the learner so original mark at the Internal Assessment could be non-appearance for one of the components of the Internal Assessment.



a) If on previous occasion a disciplinary action was taken against a student for malpractice used at examination and he/she is caught again formal practices used at the examinations, in this even the/she shall be dealt with severely. Enhanced punishment can be imposed on such students. This enhanced punishment may extend to double the punishment provided for the offence, when committed at these condor subsequent examination.

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- b) Practical/Dissertation/Project Report Examination.: Student involved in malpractices at Practical/Dissertation/Project Report Examinations shall be dealt with as per the punishment provided for the theory examination.
- c) The competent authority, in addition to above mentioned punishments, may impose a fine on the student declared guilty.

*(Note: The term "Annulment of Performance in Full." includes performance of the student at the theory as well as Annual Practical Examination, but does not include performance at term work, project work with its term work, oral or practical and dissertation examinations unless malpractice used thereat).

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1) NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME(N.S.S.)

The Department of lifelong learning and extension (D.L.L.&E) is the University Co- curricular activity. As per the circular DLLE/COLL/ 274/of 2018 dated 11th June, 2018, The students participating in the Extension Work under this Department are entitled to the benefit of Ten Grace Marks on the satisfactory completion of 120 hours of work under various Extension Work Projects. A participation Charge of Rs. 200/- (Rupees two hundred only) as approved by the Management Council is to be collected from each student at the time of Registration. The college started this activity since academic year 2019-20. The total Number of enrolled students is 225 which is record participation in 1st year enrollment in any college.

3) NATIONAL CADET CORPS(N.C.C.)

College has submitted a proposal to start N.C.C. unit for boys & girls from the area ARMY, NAVY & AIRWING in our College. The permission is awaited. Students who are interested in enrolling in N.C.C. should submit an application giving details such as class, division & Roll. No. in office.

4) CAREER COUNSELING AND PLACMENT CELL

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell of the College is dynamic body functioning to provide whole some development to the students. The cell works under the guidance of placement

committee who are supported by student representatives.


10) INDUSTRIAL VISIT







CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

- 1. Student should always carry their valid College Identity Card prominently displayed whenever in the college or representing the college in any other place. Students without I-card will not be allowed to enter the college premises. Identity card must be produced whenever demanded by any of the college staff.
- During class hours, students should not roam around in the college premises or make noise. 2. Silence should be maintained in classrooms, library, laboratories and corridors.
- Though there is no dress code, all students are expected to observed corum with regard to 3. clothing and behavior.
- While representing college, student's behavior must not be detrimental to the image of the college 4.
- 5. Students shall not bring outsiders to the college; no person should be invited to address a meeting in college premises.
- Students shall not collect any fund from other students without the written permission of the 6. Principal.
- Students shall not organize picnic, excursion, trips etc. without the prior written permission of the 7. Principal.
- 8. Students should not write on walls, benches and should help in maintaining the college premises neat and clean.
- 9. Use of mobile phones, tobacco and paan is strictly prohibited in the college premises.
- *10.* Any violation will be treated as Misconduct.

The powers relating to the disciplinary action in the college will rest with the Principal and his/her decision in this respect shall be final. Anyone who violates the code of conduct will be strictly dealt with.



PREAMBLE: In view of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 8.05.2009 and in consideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging.

WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING?

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.

- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
- g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING:

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed herein under:

• The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.

- The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments ,namely;
 - a) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - b) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
 - c) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
 - d) Withholding results.

- e) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- f) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- g) Cancellation of admission.
- h) Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
- i) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall ie, (i) in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; (ii) in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor. (iii)in the case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.

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Where in the opinion of the appointing authority, a lapse is attributable to any member of the faculty or staff of the institution, in the matter of reporting or taking prompt action to prevent an incident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude towards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations or otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action ,in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faculty or staff. Provided that where such lapse is attributable to the Head of the institution, the authority designated to appoint such Head shall take such departmental disciplinary action; and such action shall be without prejudice to any action that may be taken under the penal laws for abetment to flagging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.




